

Double Master Bonn + Tsukuba

What is TEACH?

Three leading universities from Germany (University of Bonn), Japan (University of Tsukuba) and South Korea (Korea University in Seoul) offer their Master's students the opportunity to acquire a double Master's degree in selected courses: that of their home university and that of one of the two partners.

Students at the University of Bonn can therefore obtain a Master's degree from Korea University in Seoul (labeled 1 in the graphic above) or the

University of Tsukuba (labeled 2 above).

The aim of the four-semester course is to develop solid regional, linguistic and methodological skills for comparative cultural, inter- and transnational work and research in Europe and East Asia. This is why they all study one semester each in Germany, Japan and Korea and a further semester at their home university. The students from all three universities stay together as a group for most of their studies.

How do you become a TEACH student?

The prerequisite is enrollment in one of the degree programs participating in TEACH.

In Bonn, this is the **TEACH Master's program** at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities.

Five students per partner university can be nominated for TEACH **each year**. You have to apply for this. The joint TEACH committee of the three universities then decides which applicants are accepted into TEACH.

What are the special requirements?

In addition to the general requirements for the participating Master's programs, applicants must have already studied either Japanese or Korean at the University of Bonn (at least 60 LP in one of these two languages must be proven). In addition, the previous degree must have been completed with above-average grades.

Who can receive a DAAD scholarship?

To be eligible for a DAAD scholarship, you must also have German citizenship or be equivalent to a German citizen within the meaning of the BaFöG. We will be happy to provide more detailed information on request.

Three fields of study. One common goal.

All TEACH students take the **core curriculum**, which consists of three fields of study:

Regional studies

In this field of study, students deepen their knowledge of the history and culture of Germany and Europe, Japan, Korea and East Asia. They learn to discover and categorize similarities, but also divisive developments between these countries and regions.

Joint Research Studies

Since their modernization in the 19th and 20th centuries, Germany, Japan and Korea have been 20th century are connected with each other in many ways, but have also developed differently. These connections and developments are the focus of the **Joint Research Studies**. They are organized jointly by lecturers from all three universities. Regional integration, cultural comparison and international relations are examined here. In the joint discussions and supervised written work, students also practise exchanging their academic findings in the three participating languages.

Language studies

Students from Bonn expand their knowledge of their first East Asian language (Japanese or Korean) and acquire

or deepen their knowledge of the other language. Communication in the joint courses can therefore take place in any of the three languages. To bridge the gap, all universities also offer courses in English. This ensures that students can succeed at all study locations.
